As March 31st wraps up another fiscal year for Nydia Temple, I want to share some highlights of this year.

- 1. The three costume accounts being held by the temple were closed and the money in those accounts was transferred to the units. From now on, the annual assessments will be paid directly to the units.
- 2. Donations to the hospital committees for the birthday parties, sewing, school room, and snack cart all increased from last year.
