
Another important item that needs to be addressed; March $31^{\rm st}$ has now passed and our 2015 Dues are overdue for some of you.

Session Notes

The April Session was several things. It was Nydia Temple's birthday. During the luncheon PQ Paulette told a short history of Nydia Temple and there was birthday cake for dessert.

It was April Fools Day. JPQ Judy, Pr. Recorder PQ Beverly, and Pr. Banker Kathy wore big funny sunglasses when our new Queen Laurie was escorted in. They looked like kids instead of themselves standing up there in the front of the room.

It was also Queen Laurie and her officer's first session. She is asking the Ladies of the Household to bring items to each session of her year in support of the hospital. At this session she had asked each lady to bring a spool of thread for the hospital sewers. There wasn't a count, but there were two sacks of thread. Next session the ladies are requested to bring toys and gifts—especially for older children.

In the correspondence there was the sad news of Columbia County Nile Club's dissolution. They had been a Nile club since 1945. There was also a notice that there are two vacancies for directors in the DON foundation.

There were annual reports given. Pr. Banker reported that we came out \$3600 in the black this year, and that's the second year in a row that we have ended in the black! Pr. Recorder reported on member numbers. We started the year with 559, lost 42, and gained 38 which leaves us with 555 not including dual members. Of the ones we lost 20 had died, but 17 were dropped for non-payment of dues. PQ Ruth spoke about the hospital sewers, and mentioned that Pr. Reva Ortez and Pr. Dana Maness, who had been hospital sewers for over 10 years, had retired from the group.

The Ways & Means report indicated that there were to be two fundraisers for the Temple this year. One is asking for additional donations with dues, and \$2500 had been donated this way. The other fundraiser will be the auction at the December session. (See article pg. 14.)

Pr. Marilyn Marsh was installed as Pr. Zuleika. JPQ Judy told about being honored by the Hospital. (See article pg. 6.) Permission was given by the Temple for Queen Laurie to perform Initiations by Obligation this year as appropriate.

All in all it was a pretty good first session. Everyone seemed to know their part and things went smoothly. Hope to see you all at the next session in May!

Hospital Highlights

Being a Shriner's Kid

First, let me explain a little bit about how I became a patient. I was born on June 25, 1936. My parents, Doris and Edwin McElroy, were expecting a single child. When it came time for delivery, there were twins. My brother. Donald e. McElroy, was 7 lbs. and I weighed less than 4 lbs. My mother told me that I was pushed up against him and did not get much nutrition.

My right side was affected and was thought to be pediatric paralysis. They later called it a spastic condition. My development was slowed, and I didn't learn to walk until after I was a year old. I could not walk on the heal of my right foot or straighter my right arm.

At that point in time, children of Shriners were not allowed to be patients. So, my father had to get permission for me to be treated.

They waited until I was nine years old; until the doctors decided how to treat my condition. In April 1946, I was admitted to the Shrine Hospital for Crippled Children—Portland Unit located at N.E. 82nd and Sandy Blvd. They performed surgery on my right leg, stretching the cord in the back of my leg so I could walk with my foot flat. They chose not the have surgery on my arm because my mother was afraid it would end up stiff, and I wouldn't be able to bend it.

I was in the hospital from April to June. I got out shortly before my 10th birthday, having spent 65 days as an in-patient. I was very homesick. My parents could come and visit. My sister, Shirley, was 20 so she was allowed in, but my twin brother had to stand outside and wave at me. One time when I was homesick, I dared the nurses to put me in a baby bed and take me out to see the Rose Festival Queen and her court. They did. Sometimes they let me visit the infant patients to take my mind off things. A nine year old doesn't always understand that the doctors and nurses are there to help them. The girls were at one end of the hall and the boys were at the other end. While I was there, I attended school provided by teachers that came and worked with the kids. When I got home, they said I had missed too much school, so I had to take the 4th grade over again. I met a girl there from Prosser, WA. We kept in touch with her for about two years. Back in the 1940's, they didn't let you up on your feet very much. I had a cast on and used crutches until it came off. I had everyone autograph it for me. They let me take it home as a souvenir. After the cast came off of my foot, I had to learn to walk again. I had a brace on my leg for almost two years. My mother worked on me with exercises to build strength so I could get the brace removed.

After I joined Daughters of the Nile, my mom and I worked up at the new Shrine Hospital as volunteers. KOIN TV honored us at the hospital as some of their community heroes.





We had 12 Birthday Parties in 2014-2015. Usually our Supreme Queen's visit is an extra party, however her visit to the hospital was on our regular birthday party day.

Our committee Party members are Pr. Shirley Stanfill, Pr. Dorothy Lewis, PQ Gerry Brown, Pr. Rosemary Farris, and Pr. Marilyn Marsh. Pr. Lorraine Campbell joined Nile in November and joined the Birthday Party Committee. Prs. Patty Baldwin and Isabelle York have attended a few parties. At our March party Queen Laurie Winchester was in attendance. Pat Grenna was also in attendance at our March party. Our Clowns participated in 11 parties: Klutz PaPa, Bumps, Keyes, Slym, and Stretch.

Donations were received from Union, Eugene, and Beth Eden Nile Clubs.

Individual donations: Barbara Miner, a non-member, made monthly donations. Monthly donations were also received from Pr. Shirley Moore. Prs. a Look Back in the Distory of Nydia Temple

(This is the first article of a look back in history)

The organization "Daughters of the Nile" itself just celebrated their centennial .. 100 years of history. Nydia Temple is getting closer and closer to the time when we will celebrate our beloved temple's 100th Birthday. We hope you enjoy each small glimpse of historical information from days gone by in future Nydian publications.

(Excerpt from the very first minute book)

The actual first gathering to interest a few ladies in organizing a Temple of Daughters of the Nile in Portland, Oregon was April 9, 1919. Mrs. Walter Holman (Mabel) called a few ladies to her home to discuss this organization. The ideas presented were easily accepted and additional information regarding the possibilities was requested from Seattle.

On April 19, 1919 while meeting at the home of Mrs. H.T. Hutchinson (Lillian) the organization foundation was established; they determined the organization would be open to wives, mothers and sisters of Shrine members. Then on April 22, 1919 Mrs. Edith Gattis, Supreme Queen of Supreme Temple of Seattle arrived to give the obligation to 35 princesses; parts of the initiation was read from the ritual with explanations. April 23, 1919 Queen Mabel Holman, Pr. Royal, Pr. Tirzah and Pr. Recorder met in the office of the Hugh J. Boyd Masonic Temple as the Ordinance was given for all Charter members by Supreme Queen Edith Gattis. The meeting was almost a jubilee when Pr. Recorder Adda Cellars reported almost \$500.00 of paid membership money was on hand. The Charter Members decided on the first Wednesday of every month as the regular Session date and after much discussion, chose the name "Nydia" for this new Temple Name. The Supreme Queen was very gratified that she could now report Nydia was ready for a Charter.
