



FUN FACTS FROM WAY BACK

Nydia Temple was presented its charter on April 24, 1919, becoming the fourth Temple of the newly formed Daughters of the Nile organization which began in 1913. Back in those days, and for many years to follow, articles in the "women's section" of the local newspapers printed sometimes large and sometimes small articles about Nydia Temple. With the help of Noble John Smith, historian for Al Kader Shriners and a retired librarian, and PQ Paulette Schlee, Princess Recorder, we will be sharing these fun facts from way back. -- Princess Tirzah Kathy Walliker.

Article from the Society News of the Morning Oregonian Newspaper on June 11, 1920:

One hundred and fifty candidates will present themselves Saturday, June 12, 1920, at Pythian Temple, West Park and Yamhill Streets, for initiation into Nydia Temple. Daughters of the Nile Ceremonial will be held at 1 pm. Lunch will be served at noon. A double quartet will sing during the spiritual service. A program will be given at 4 pm at which time the patrol, a new organization of the Temple, will drill. Oriental costumes have been procured to add greatly to the effect of the drill. Special music will be given. A solo will be rendered by Faye Leonard. Queen Berkey, of Elkarnet Temple, Daughters of the Nile, will give a whistling solo. Patrol members will be: Katherine Blaesing, Georgia Brown, Mary Ellen Bryan, Alice J. Davidson, Ruth A. Davidson, Kate Marie Cook, Grace Green, Jean T. Greene, Hulda Tennant, Bertha M. Johnson, Marguerite A. Siglin, Pearl McJury, Norah Oswald, Nellie E. Richmond, Lee Killingsworth, Mabel J. Smith, Sadie M. Smith, Grace Ettinger, Fay E. Alexander, Georgia Cowgill, Mary Kaser, Lulu E. Keefer and Anna B. Henney.

Article from the Women's Activities Section of the Sunday Oregonian, February 26, 1928: The Irvington sewing circle of Nydia Temple no. 4, Daughters of the Nile, held a bridge party at the home of its chairman, Mrs. Will H. See, 423 East Twenty-fourth Street North,

Tuesday night, to raise funds with which to purchase an electric sewing machine for the use of the circle, which meets the second Wednesday of each month to sew for the Shriners' Hospital for Crippled Children.



Where in the World is Nydia? In November, 2017, this is where I am:

I am in a capital city that shares its name with a city and a county, but is located in an unincorporated area, and for a city of this size, it is considered remote by world standards. It is located on a sheltered harbor or calm port, where the USS Minnow set sail for a three hour tour. There are no professional sports teams here, but is recognized as the fittest city in the country. Believe it or not, this city has the worst highway traffic congestion in its country, with commuters wasting an average of 58 hours a year, however, its rapid transit system has been honored twice recently. Until 1969, the capital building was a "palace", and now is restored as a popular Victorian era museum. One of the top ten hospitals in this city (actually it's no. 7) is a Shriners Hospital for Children.

Did You Know...?

Did you know the Portland Shriners Hospital holds a walk-in "fracture clinic" every weekday morning? Due to the amount of pediatric fractures that occur annually, the Portland Shriners Hospital began its daily walk-in fracture clinic two years ago. Drop in any time between 7:30 and 9:00 am and bring the x-ray taken at the emergency room or urgent care clinic. Be seen, treated, casted, and on your way home in about two hours. The Portland Shriners Hospital is the PNW's largest pediatric orthopedic group, and are the experts for the best fracture and sports injury care.

Hospital Sewing

Howdy ladies. The Hospital Sewing Committee keeps sewing along each week keeping the Hospital and Patients supplied with Inpatient Quilts, Transition Quilts, shorts, bags and whatever else the folks at the Hospital come up with.

The newest change is with the shorts. After talking with folks in the various departments and with Housekeeping, we have decided to color-code the sizes of shorts. We also found out that these shorts are being laundered by Housekeeping for multiple use. Since that is the case, we want to use fabric that is up to multiple washings. We have access to a fabric distributor, so we can buy bolts of the fabric and elastic which brings the cost for shorts to about \$2.75 for small size to \$4.50 for the largest. The patterns have been updated, so if you have old patterns, please discard them. I will be happy to send you new patterns, if you wish to make shorts, and the fabric requirements. We would also welcome contributions to off-set the cost of the materials. Please contact PQ Judy Smith or me if you have any questions or need patterns.

Billie Wallace has been producing really cute walker/wheelchair bags, and so is now our official bag lady. Carol Livie updated the shorts instructions, and Judy Smith updated the bag instructions (both complete with pictures!). Since I don't do any actual sewing up at the hospital, (I do all the "cutting"...yes, I get to use a sharp instrument...go figure!), I really appreciate the help all the ladies give in making sure our patterns and instructions are correct. Judy, Penny, Ruthie, Charlene, Paulette, Billie, Delores, Bunny, Loretta, Anjee, Carol, Marilyn—THANK YOU—for your tireless help and friendship. We could not provide the items for the hospital and patients without the additional help of all the Ladies of the Household, so hugs and thanks to all of you, too.

Standing Rules voted upon and passed at the September Session

NYDIA TEMPLE NO. 4 DAUGHTERS OF THE NILE STANDING RULES- September 6, 2017

- Admission to all open affairs given by Nydia Temple No. 4 shall be limited to members and invited guests only.
 No sectarian or political matter shall be introduced or discussed in the Temple.
 Nomination speeches shall be limited to one and one-half minutes and there shall be no seconding speeches

- The Queen may appoint a Parliamentarian.
- Representation of Nydia Temple No. 4 by Uniformed Units at Supreme Temple Annual Sessions shall be governed by the following policies:
 - (a) Each Unit sent to a Supreme Session shall be limited to eighteen (18) members, including Captain, Director and/or Instructor, and accompanist.
 - (b) Only one Unit shall be sent to a Supreme Session each year, the rotation to follow the pattern set in original drawing.
 - (c) Each Unit shall maintain a high standard of proficiency as approved by the Queen. A Unit not so qualified, or which has forfeited its scheduled year, shall not represent the Temple until its next scheduled year.
 - The Unit next scheduled to attend Supreme Session shall notify the Temple by the January Stated Session if the Unit is planning to attend. If no one from the Unit is able to attend, one of the remaining Units may apply to represent the Temple with the same financial allowance as stated in Nydia Temple No. 4 Bylaws, Article VI, Section This representation would not change the rotation pattern as stated in 5 (b).
- There shall be a Mistress of the Robes, whose duty shall be to have the robes of all officers in proper condition for Ceremonials. She may have an appointed assistant. They will perform necessary repairs and replacements as needed. They shall keep all Ceremonial costumes clean and in good repair. They MAY charge the temple for the costs of necessary changes to the costumes.
- The Queen Elect shall appoint the following Temple Committees to serve during her term of office:
 - (a) Inventory. This committee shall make a complete inventory of all property belonging to the Temple, including robes and uniforms. This committee shall make a report at the May Stated Session. Chairman of this Committee shall be the Princess Marshal and should include a representative from each of the Uniformed Units. Any necessary repairs or replacements will be investigated and recommendations made by a special committee appointed by the Queen, as necessary. This committee shall then submit a report to the Finance Committee and the membership concerning all costs, designs, colors and any other information regarding these purchases. The Temple must approve the purchase before any contracts are signed or purchases are made.
 - (b) Nydian/Yearbook. (See Rule #8)
 - (c)Transportation. Assists those Princesses needing transportation to Stated Sessions, Annual Events and other Temple activities.
 - (d) Webmaster/Facebook Admin. Maintains and updates all electronic media belonging to the Temple.
 - (e) White Rose/Memorial. Arranges and performs memorial services at the request of the family of a Member. Has charge of the paraphernalia necessary for the White Rose Ceremony.
- 8. The Annual Year Book, Calendar, Roster, Nydia Temple Bylaws and Standing Rules shall be available at the May Stated Session, or mailed to those not present by May 15.
- 9. All pro-tems and/or prompters shall be appointed only by the Queen.
- 10. Any property belonging to Nydia Temple No. 4, Daughters of the Nile that is removed from the Temple premises, for any reason, must be listed, signed for and noted in Stated Session minutes. All property must be returned at the next Stated Session following removal unless approval is given by vote of the membership. Personal property stored at the Temple is exempt. When extenuating circumstances necessitate removal of Temple property between Stated Sessions, the Queen and/or Recorder must be notified immediately. Proper record shall be made at the next Stated Session.
- 11. No Nydia Temple No. 4 Nile Club, Unit or Sewing Group shall hold a meeting or schedule an event on a regularly scheduled Nydia Temple No. 4 Stated Session or Supreme Queen's Official Visit.
- 12. The Queen, Princess Recorder and Princess Banker shall be authorized to transact the financial business of the Temple during the summer months.


