When my son was 17 years old, he died in a traffic accident. It was totally unexpected, and I also felt a great deal of guilt as I had given him the car he was driving though he was no longer living with me. Each member of the family dealt with his death in a different manner. My oldest daughter, Angela, shared pictures. Heather wrote a poem. Angie wrote a song (but I didn't know that yet as it was her college senior project).

I listened to Angie's CD over and over and kept repeating song #5. I shared it with Judy Smith at a Rainbow overnighter. Another adult present asked what the song's name was. Of course I didn't know because I needed my glasses on to read it. The name of it was "Nick's Song." Naturally I fell apart realizing the meaning and retired to my cabin for the night.

The cabin was cold, and I was very upset. I snuggled up in the covers and cried. Suddenly the light in the room changed from darkness to purple. I felt a presence in the room and then warmth on my back like I was being touched by a hand. My burden was immediately lifted.

Another instance was when I picked up my husband

Jerry's ashes, all the lights came on in my car as I left the parking lot. Jerry's ashes were seat-belted on the front seat. I ultimately drove to the dealership to see if they could figure out the problem. There was no problem, and it never happened again. I know it was a reminder he was still with me.

My mother, in her later years, would indicate she was talking with my father who had died several years earlier. She would raise her arm to a corner of the room (always the same corner) and speak to him. She knew he was there with her.

These are just a few of my angel visitors, and there have been many. These angels are with us, reassuring, protecting, directing, and giving us courage. They are there. May there always be angels among us.

Sewing Committee


The hospital has asked for our help with the on-going repurposing project. They have a large quantity of special fabric made from plastic that is used to cover surgical instrument trays before surgery. This material is used once in a sterile environment, then sent to the land fill. We are continuing, at the hospital's request, to make Patient Personal Belongings Bags out of this material. They are very durable, and the patients and families can use them for a long time.

The Sewing Committee and ladies of the household made over 150 of these bags before the shut-down. They have all been given out to surgical patients! We have about 100 more made at home that I will get to the hospital in November. However, we could certainly use your help filling the need. They are not hard. Let me know if you are willing to help sew, and I will get materials and instructions to you.



At the present time, the hospital is not giving out inpatient quilts. We have quite an inventory of these at the present time, which we are pleased with, and are hoping that in the future we will be able to give each surgical patient a gift of love. As with all things during this weird time, we will have to patiently wait for direction from the hospital. They are continuing to give out the Nydia gift of a Transition Quilt when patients graduate, so we have been concentrating on those, as well as shorts and wheelchair/walker bags.

WHAT HAPPENS WITH MY INITIATION FEES?

Back when we decided to join Nydia Temple No. 4, Daughters of the Nile, we were asked to pay an *initiation fee*. In recent years, the amount of that fee has been \$75. But have you ever wondered where that money goes and what you get for your investment?

First and foremost, the fee includes a new member's dues (pro-rated for the year that she joins and the full next year) per our Bylaws. Our yearly dues are currently \$32, so this relieves a financial burden on a new member.

Also figured into the fees are the Supreme Temple per capita and insurance at \$9 per year. We are obligated to pay these amounts to the Supreme Temple for every primary member of Nydia Temple. The only exceptions are our dual members because their supreme fees will be paid by their primary temple.

Each newly initiated member will receive our newsletter, so there is a cost of printing and postage. They will receive their *Jewel of the Order* during their Ceremonial and their white rose, both of which are paid for from their fees.

It is traditional at Nydia Temple for new candidates to be our guests at the banquet held in their honor after the Ceremonial. This expense is also figured into the fees collected.

When you are talking with a lady who may be interested in joining Nydia Temple, you can explain how her fee is used. Sometimes just a quick explanation will make the difference in a lady's understanding.

- 3. Is the venue disinfected prior to the event?
- 4. Will you require wearing of masks?
- 5. Are you taking the temperature of attendees at the entrance?
- 6. Have you considered the number of attendees and does it exceed the "crowd" guidelines?

The Chairman of the Supreme Insurance Committee, Georganne Rodgers-Garn, PQ, assures us the carrier will defend a suit, but in order to have an affirmative defense, we will need documentation on all the above. She also mentions the adverse effect of negative publicity to us, the venue, and perhaps to the Shriners Hospital.

We strive to make our environment as healthy as possible. We must continue to abide by our pandemic restrictions and limited activities. Miss Covid is certainly making our lives challenging, but remember, we are strong women, and we will persevere.
