


2014 Nydia Temple Cruisers

NEW DRESS CODE INFORMATION

As was reported in the July Nydian, the Supreme Regulations on the Dress Code has changed. It now reads:

PROTOCOL, Section 1. Dress, A Attire (Page p-1) now reads: Formal pants and dressy pant suits may be acceptable attire at a **Subordinate** Temple Stated Session that does not include a Ceremonial for members not participating in the Ritualistic Ceremonies of the Order.

At the September Session, those in attendance voted on whether or not they wanted the temple to follow the new protocol, adapt it to include the wishes of the reigning Queen, or ignore the new rules altogether. The vote was 19, 16, and 20, so there was no definitive decision on the part of Nydia Temple. Therefore, we will follow our obligation and cheerfully obey the law as announced at the 2014 Supreme Nile Session.

There have been some questions as to what is an appropriate dressy pants suit etc. My opinion is when in doubt, wear a dress! But, I found a couple of pictures that might help. Formal pants with a formal top is acceptable. So, Ladies of the Household, I am not worried about this, and as I have said before, the important thing is that you choose to be in attendance at the session.

SUPREME TEMPLE DAUGHTERS OF THE NILE LEGISLATION RESULTS SUPREME TEMPLE ANNUAL SESSION 2014 – OMAHA, NEBRASKA

Please be aware of the changes made to the Supreme Temple Daughters of the Nile Bylaws (2013 Revision) by the voting Delegates at the Supreme Temple Ninety-eighth Annual Supreme Session in Omaha, Nebraska. These changes were effective as of the day enacted.

Amendment O-1 to **PART II, ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP, SECTION 1. Eligibility (a), Page 56.** This amendment, which would have expanded membership eligibility to include "or is a friend of a Daughter of the Nile," was defeated.

Amendment O-2 amended PART 1, ARTICLE I SOVEREIGNTY AND ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE, SECTION 4.

Supreme Temple Membership, Page 17. This amendment struck the word "two (2)" and inserted the word "five (5)" in the second sentence. As adopted, Section 4 now reads:

Section 4. Supreme Temple Membership

Membership in the Supreme Temple shall be the voting Delegates. These members shall be: Past Supreme Queens, Supreme Temple Elective/Appointive Officers, Reigning Queens, Princesses Royal, Princesses Tirzah, Princesses Badoura, Past Queens and five (5) Ladies of the Household from each of the Subordinate Temples.

Amendment O-3 to **PART II, ARTICLE IV OFFICIAL TEMPLE PROPERTIES, SECTION 1. Ritual (a)** and (b), Page 62. This amendment, which would have substituted three (3) Rituals for eighteen (18), was defeated.

Amendment O-4, as amended, inserted a new **PART II, ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP, SECTION 12. Obligation Only Initiation** on Page 58. As adopted, Section 12 reads:

Section 12. **Obligation Only Initiation**

In extenuating circumstances and with the vote of the Temple, a Temple may initiate a petitioner(s) with the Queen or Past Queen-designate administering the Obligation at a Temple Club or other appropriate place. A member(s) so initiated shall sign the Membership Book and receive her/their Membership Pin(s) at the first Stated Session or Ceremonial that she/they attends.

Amendment O-5 to **PART II, ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP, SECTION 1. Eligibility** (a), Page 56. This amendment, which would have struck the requirement for Masonic relationship and allowed any woman to apply for membership through any member of a Temple, was defeated.

Amendment O-6 to **PART II, ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP, SECTION 2. Proposal for Membership,** Page 57. This amendment, which would have allowed any woman to apply for membership and institute a Committee of Inquiry (Investigation Committee), was deemed not in order because the previous amendment on eligibility which would have allowed any woman to apply for membership was defeated. The proposed process for handling an application for membership cannot then apply.

Amendment O-7 to PART II, ARTICLE IV OFFICIAL TEMPLE PROPERTIES, SECTION 2. Secret Work, Page 62. This amendment, which would have reduced the requirement for the Junior Past Queen to only recite the Secret Work at all Ceremonials and a minimum of three (3) Stated Sessions per year, was defeated.

Amendment O-8, as amended, amended PART II, ARTICLE IV OFFICIAL TEMPLE PROPERTIES, SECTION 1. Ritual (a) and (b), Page 62. As adopted, sections (a), (b) and (c) now read:

Each Subordinate Temple is issued a minimum of four (4) Rituals. They are the property of the Temple and the Princess Recorder is responsible for them.

The Princess Recorder shall issue the Rituals to any member requesting a Ritual for temporary use. The member shall sign a log when issued a Ritual. The member shall sign the log when the Ritual is returned.

The member shall pay the current price for any Ritual that is not returned to the Princess Recorder.

Amendment O-9 amended **PART II, ARTICLE I MEMBERSHIP, SECTION 1. Eligibility** (a), Page 56. This amendment expanded the membership eligibility to include a former patient, with or without Shrine or Masonic relationship, at a Shriners Hospital for Children®. As adopted, section (a) now reads:

Eligibility to membership in a Temple shall be open to a woman of good character who is eighteen years of age or older and is related by birth or marriage to a Shriner, Master Mason, or Daughter of the Nile, or is a Majority Member in Good Standing of a Masonic-related organization for girls; or who was a patient, with or without Shrine or Masonic relationship, at a Shriners Hospital for Children®. The Proposal for Membership shall be signed and submitted by two members in Good Standing who are acquainted with, and will vouch for, the woman.

Amendment O-10 amended PART I, ARTICLE IV SUPREME TEMPLE COMMITTEES, SECTION 1. Standing Committees (1) Convention Committee, Page 44. This amendment added a new section (1) Convention Committee. As adopted, section (1) now reads:

(1) Convention Committee shall be comprised of at least four (4) members who shall be available to assist with competitive negotiation of contracts with the Supreme Session hostess city chosen by the Supreme Princess Badoura; and provide assistance with other details in planning the convention, including experienced training for the Supreme Session registration management system.

Amendment O-11 to PART I, ARTICLE I SOVEREIGNTY AND ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE, SECTION 4. Supreme Temple

<u>Membership</u>, Page 17. This amendment, which would have allowed all Daughters of the Nile in Good Standing who were registered and in attendance at the Annual Session to vote, was defeated.

Additionally, please be aware of the change made to the Supreme Temple Daughters of the Nile Protocol (2013 Revision) by the Board of Directors at the Annual Board Meeting held in Omaha, Nebraska. This change was effective as of the day enacted. The change was made after a survey poll was conducted in the Subordinate Temples, which voted 76 Approved and 60 Disapproved.

Therefore, PROTOCOL, Section I. DRESS, A. ATTIRE (Page P-1) now reads:

3. Formal pants and dressy pant suits may be acceptable attire at a **Subordinate Temple Stated Session** that does not include a Ceremonial for members not participating in the Ritualistic Ceremonies of the Order.

Please note the words "may be." The Board of Directors recognizes that your Temple may have certain customs and traditions they wish to retain. It also realizes that not all Temple members will want to wear dressy pants or pant suits to your Stated Sessions. So, you now have the option of wearing dressy pants or pant suits or continuing with your Temple tradition of wearing dresses or skirts to your Sessions. Such a decision should be made for your Temple by a vote of the Temple.




